About UGIM

The symposium brings together operators, mangers, administrators of facilities involved in micro/nanotechnology fabrication and characterization university lab management around the world; it provides a forum for exchanging information and presenting new lab operations and educational concepts. Representatives of shared facilities, ranging from new labs to nationally and internationally recognized entities, have found this symposium an excellent forum for exchanging information and networking. Typical topics include industry/university interactions, new equipment trends, best practices, collaborative research, and training efforts.

Event Sponsorship Levels

The UGIM conference consists of three pillars:

- Talks to exchange ideas
- Tours to see operation of the host site (MIT.nano in 2024)
- Vendor booths and event sponsorship

Vendor booths at UGIM are an integral part of the conference, as lab managers, staff, and decision makers are able to learn about new tools and opportunities for expanding their lab capabilities. Sponsorship (provided by vendor contributions) enables us to integrate social activities (dinner events) and extensive breaks (e.g., 40 mins for refreshment breaks; 100 minutes for lunch) to provide time for participants to engage with vendors.

The vendor-exhibit space also will have a monitor wall with a live-stream of the conference: to allow vendors to follow the program as well as participants to more easily allocate their time between talks of interest and discussions with vendors.

Our goal is to enable focused discussions with vendors and maximize exposure to different technologies. The vendor space will be immediately outside the lecture room. However, to avoid crowding and allow fruitful discussions, we will limit the number of vendors on each day to 25 tables. Therefore, our sponsorship levels offer a choice for either Monday or Tuesday full day (or both via add-ons) as well as Wednesday morning (until the conclusion of the conference at approximately noon). Setup of tables is available the night before.

As with past UGIM conferences, UGIM 2024 will host a welcome reception & sit-down dinner on Monday, as well as a less formal dinner on Tuesday. Monday's event will take place at the Museum of Fine Arts (MFA) Boston. Tuesday's event will be at the MIT Museum, a short 5-minute walk from our conference venue. Attendees can roam the entire museum where food stations will be distributed throughout. An event space that is part of the main exhibit floor will host the bar – as well as a select number of "vendor discussion tables" – allowing us to also recognize the Platinum sponsors more prominently.

The vendor discussion tables are meant to provide an opportunity for attendees to connect with select vendors in a more social setting and continue discussions that may have started during the conference. Tables are allocated to specific vendors with labels/signage.

The MIT Museum dinner itself is standing/walking compatible. However, attendees can rest and sit at various locations throughout the museum. The event space with the vendor discussion tables will naturally draw traffic due to the proximity of the bar and its location on the main exhibit floor.

Sunday Program

The main program of UGIM focuses on how to run multifaceted shared-facility spaces - but the Sunday session adds to this by looking at how to design & build such facilities. Thus, the Sunday theme will be twofold: How MIT.nano was built, and a series of talks about "tips for building a lab". The Sunday program consists of a series of short talks by experts in the field, each with a very specific focus on how to design/build a particular aspect of a facility. Out guiding theme is "Top 3 things everyone should really know about [xzy system]". In addition, we will offer staff- and self-guided tours of MIT.nano, typically starting every 30 to 60 minutes and covering all areas: Fab, Characterization, Infrastructure, Packaging, Immersion Lab, and the MIT Campus.
